

**Highlights of the University's Achievements
in Response to National Commission Recommendations, Fall 2005**

Alumni Relations

- *Dramatic increase in the number of alumni clubs, events, and participants*
- *Doubled alumni participation in on campus reunion events*
- *Development of a class agent program with over 50 volunteers*
- *Improved, more complete database of alumni*
- *Enhanced communications through new Pacific alumni website and e-newsletter*

Gladys L. Benerd School of Education

- *Nearly \$1 million raised for student scholarships*
- *Facilities renovations, including technology upgrades*

The College of the Pacific

- *New \$2.2 million Humanities Building opened in Fall 2004*
- *New, technology-rich Ornelas Language Laboratory and other technology-related upgrades*
- *Over \$13 million raised for Biological Sciences Building*
- *New Pacific Humanities Center provides programming for campus*

Arthur A. Dugoni School of Dentistry

- *Named the School to honor the current dean with a \$50 million commitment by alumni and friends*
- *Expanded community care programs: new clinic programs serving patient needs in Stockton (opened 2003-04), City of San Francisco Laguna Honda Hospital (begun 2004-05)*
- *Increases in applicant pool, student selectivity, student diversity, financial aid, and overall student academic performance*
- *\$8 million raised for student scholarship; \$8 million for chairs and professorships*
- *Over \$15 million in facilities improvements and new construction*

School of Engineering and Computer Science

- *Over \$850,000 invested in new labs and updating and renovating current labs*
- *Plans for a new Technology Center developed with significant funding commitments*
- *Under the Heyborne Leadership Center, nearly \$1 million raised for leadership development and research support*
- *Over \$3 million in grants and contracts*

Eberhardt School of Business

- *Dramatic increase in student selectivity for both undergraduate and MBA programs*
- *Exceeded \$10 million Campaign goal; \$2 million in scholarship funds, \$6.5 million for endowed chairs*
- *New computer classroom, upgraded computer laboratory, wireless network access throughout Weber Hall*
- *Successful, expanded outreach activities: Business Forecasting Center, Institute for Family Business*

McGeorge School of Law

- *Applicant pool more than doubled; student selectivity increased*
- *Strategic plan identifies three areas of distinctiveness to be developed: Advocacy, Governmental Affairs, and Global Business and Development*
- *Marketing efforts enhance visibility and reputation of the School*
- *Expansion of clinical experiences integrated with classroom learning, such as the new Immigration Law Clinic*
- *Campus Master Plan completed*
- *Renovation and Expansion of Library underway*

Conservatory of Music

- *Over \$1 million raised for endowed scholarships*
- *Over \$1 million raised for Brubeck Institute Endowment*
- *New B.A. in Music with Jazz Studies emphasis implemented*

Thomas J. Long Pharmacy & Health Sciences

- *Pharmacy student applicant pool the largest in the country*
- *Significant curricular revision in all three professional programs ensuring an unparalleled, current and innovative education and co-curricular opportunities*
- *100% national board passage rates for pharmacy and speech-language pathology graduates*
- *Nearly \$20 million raised*
- *New Health Sciences Learning Center opened in 2003; funded entirely through gifts*
- *Ten-fold increase in grant funding for research (from \$250,000 to \$2.5 million)*

School of International Studies

- *Enrollment growth to over 150 students*
- *Innovative mentoring program links current students with alumni of SIS, Callison, and Covell Colleges, re-engaging alumni and providing opportunities for internships and job placement for students*
