Dual Degree in Accounting

The dual degree program in accounting is a five-year accelerated program that culminates with the simultaneous award of the Bachelor of Science in Accounting and the Master of Accounting degrees.

Admission to the Program

Currently enrolled students and accepted transfer students are eligible for admission to the dual degree program upon completion of the Core Business Course Requirements (or equivalent) with an overall grade point average in the core of 3.0. Students should apply at the beginning of the semester in which they are enrolled in BUSI 113b Intermediate Accounting II.
