ENTRY-LEVEL MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (ELMSN)

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Entry-Level Master of Science in Nursing (ELMSN) program is designed to teach students with an undergraduate degree in a non-nursing field the competencies necessary to serve as a professional nurse clinician. Pacific's ELMSN offers a generalist curriculum, with optional specialty focus in population health, quality and safety, and chronic disease management. Courses are taught on the Sacramento campus, featuring a skills/simulation laboratory, with required off-site clinical rotations. Senior students will also complete a Capstone Project to Advance Evidenced-Based Patient Care, or design a Clinical Improvement Project. Graduates will be prepared to take the NCLEX RN licensing exam and obtain a Public Health Certificate.

- 3. Satisfactory completion of all prerequisite courses with minimum GPA of 3.2
