Qualification of Candidates

Qualified students are encouraged to apply if they meet the minimum criteria below. Selection will also involve a personal interview.

- Minimum 3.7 (on a 4.0 scale) cumulative high school GPA
- Minimum combined SAT Critical Reading and Math score of 1350 or ACT composite of at least 30
- Demonstrates a rigorous academic curriculum (such as Honors, AP and/or IB courses)
- Demonstrates superior leadership skills in different settings (including, but not limited to, student government or other student organizations; cultural groups; performance; research projects; creative endeavors; and community service)
- Strong interpersonal skills
