MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK (MSW)

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Pacific's Master of Social Work program prepares justice-oriented and culturally-responsive social workers who become integral components of interdisciplinary healthcare teams. Two accelerated programs are available: a 12-month Advanced Standing program for students enrolled in the BA Sociology + MSW Dual Degree Program, and a 16-month program for students with bachelors degrees in other academic disciplines.

As the only social work program dedicated to healthcare in California, this innovative program integrates simulation lab training, interprofessional education, and supervised practice in healthcare-related field sites. Students engage in a rigorous, practice-based curriculum including courses on social determinants of health, clinical interventions in healthcare, and the option to pursue a subspecialty in diabetes care and management.

- 2. Satisfactory completion of all prerequisite courses with minimum GPA of 3.3 in health studies, humanities, and social and behavioral science courses.
- 3. Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0

- 1. Completed program application with all required supporting documents by published application deadline

- 3. Minimum GPA of 2.75 earned in the last 60 units of postsecondary education.
