PACIFICCONNECT

In the event of an emergency on or near campus, the Office of Public Safety or a key administrator will send a voice and/or text message that will be distributed immediately through PacificCONNECT, notifying those registered with appropriate information about the emergency. Emergency notifications will be limited to such things as severe weather alerts, emergency building concerns, intruders or life/safety events.

All students, faculty and staff will have the opportunity to register up to four phone numbers, one text message/SMS number, and one email addresses (in addition to their Pacific email address) for emergency notifications. Please encourage your student to register for PacificCONNECT and add the appropriate numbers to be notified. We also strongly encourage all students to add the Department of Public Safety's phone numbers to their cell phone contact list.
