Research Driven

Our faculty members use research to challenge the status quo of patient care and education. Their research covers a wide spectrum of topics, including drug delivery, drug design, mental health and patient care. At Pacific, you will have the opportunity to work alongside our faculty members on cutting-edge research.

Two NIH grant funded research projects are currently underway at the School. Melanie A. Felmlee, PhD has received a four-year \$1.15 million grant from the NIH Support of Competitive Research (SCORE) Program for research focused on the differences in the way males and females process GHB. William K. Chan, PharmD, PhD received a \$382,000 NIH R15 grant to continue his research on the aryl hydrocarbon receptor.

How to Apply

You can earn a PharmD in three years, with or without a bachelor's degree, as long as you have completed at least 68 units in specific prerequisite courses. The Pharmacy College Admission Test (PCAT) is not required.

Early Action

Want to increase your chance of getting an interview? Apply by September 8. Early Action applications are reviewed in the first round, which means you will be competing with fewer applicants. Reduce stress by decreasing the time waiting for a decision. Complete your application by the Tuesday after Labor Day and you will be notified of your status by the third week in October.

Chan Family Hall

Located on North Campus, Chan Family Hall is a five-minute walk to class and adjacent to the Chan Family Health Sciences Learning Center and Clinics.
