



Pre-Pharmacy Advantage Program

Set yourself up for success as you take the first step toward a career in pharmacy. From the first day, you will build foundational skills for pharmacists. Pacific's Pre-Pharmacy Advantage Program gives first-time freshmen the opportunity to complete their undergraduate requirements in the same environment as their doctor of pharmacy (PharmD) studies.

Guaranteed PharmD admission. Pacific offers three freshman admission pathways for completing the Pre-Pharmacy Advantage Program. Each pathway requires a minimum overall 3.0 GPA and a 2.7 GPA in specific math and science courses, in addition to submission of an advancement application, an interview and a writing sample. Successfully completing each of these requirements guarantees admission into our PharmD program.

Pathways

Earn your PharmD in as few as five years. Based on academic standings, you will be placed in one of three pathways, completing your PharmD in five, six or seven years. The majority of students are placed in the 2+3 or 3+3 pathways.

Five-year

2+3

Two years of undergraduate study followed by three years of study in the professional PharmD program.

Six-year

3+3

Three years of undergraduate study followed by three years of study in the professional PharmD program.

Seven-year

4+3

Four years of undergraduate study, earning a bachelor's degree, followed by three years of study in the professional PharmD program.

Since 2007, Pacific's Medicare Part D Outreach Clinics have assisted almost 9,500 patients with their Medicare Part D drug plan, helping patients save an estimated total of \$9.35 million. Get in on the action — pre-pharmacy students are welcome to participate in these clinics.



Gain the skills you need to become a highly-skilled, patient-centered pharmacist. Starting your freshmen year, learn basic pharmaceutical calculations and practice skills such as sterile compounding, aseptic technique and prescription interpretation and filling.

The student-run Pre-Pharmacy Society hosts panels with former pre-pharmacy students, PharmD program mock interviews, mentor-mentee mixers and other networking opportunities. Learn from guest speakers about pharmacy career specialties and hear from recent PharmD graduates about their residency experiences.

There are plenty of opportunities to get involved. Choose from over 150 student organizations. Enjoy some friendly competition by joining an intramural or club team. Rush a fraternity or sorority and connect with peers who are at each stage of their PharmD journey. We are proud to have two chapters of pharmacy honor societies and four professional pharmacy fraternities.
