

Undergraduate students who are enrolled in the university’s engineering program are generally subject to the same financial aid eligibility rules and regulations as all other students; however, due to the structure of the engineering majors, students have the eligibility expansions and restrictions listed in the chart below. Graduate level engineering students are eligible for student loans.
