THE LIFE AND TIMES OF NIKOLA TESLA

INSTRUCTOR: MARC SEIFER, PHD

MONDAYS, OCTOBER 6, 13, 20, 27 & NOVEMBER 3, 10 NOON | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

This course traces the life and innovations of Nikola Tesla, from his early years and university studies in Graz and Prague to his groundbreaking work in electricity and wireless technology. We will explore his collaborations and rivalries, including his work with Thomas Edison, the "War of the Currents" between AC and DC power, and his partnership with George Westinghouse, which led to the lighting of the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. Key topics include Tesla's telautomaton invention, his wireless experiments, and his race against Marconi in the development of radio. We will examine the Wardenclyffe—Tesla's ambitious wireless transmission tower, his work during World War I with Telefunken, and his interactions with Franklin Roosevelt. We will conclude with Tesla's later-life invention of the particle beam weapon, his negotiations to sell it to the Allies during World War II, and the mystery surrounding his secret papers after his death.

THE AFRICAN AMERICAN MILITARY EXPERIENCE: FROM REVOLUTION TO CIVIL RIGHTS

INSTRUCTOR: JOHN LANGELLIER

TUESDAYS, OCTOBER 7, 14, 21, 28 & NOVEMBER 4, 11 4 PM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

African Americans have served in every U.S. military conflict, fighting for both their country and their own rights. From Black patriots in the Revolutionary War to the 180,000 African Americans who fought for the Union in the Civil War, their contributions have shaped American history. After the war, Blacksoldiers gained congressional approval to enlist in the peacetime Army, leading to the formation of the "Buffalo Soldiers." This course traces their service from the War of 1812 to World War II, highlighting their valor in conflicts abroad and their struggle against segregation and discrimination at home. It is the story of their resilience, sacrifice, and fight for equality in a nation that often failed to recognize their service.

CREATIVE CONSERVATION

INSTRUCTOR: STEPHANIE ARNE

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 8, 15, 22, 29, & NOVEMBER 5, 12 2 PM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

Become educated, entertained, and empowered to become more effective stewards of the natural world. Through real-life conservation stories—drawn from the instructor's personal experiences and her time as host of Mutual of Omaha's Wild Kingdom—we will highlight the impact of passionate individuals working together to address complex environmental challenges. This course explores how diverse perspectives and unique skills contribute to conservation efforts, offering participants practical ways to take meaningful action in protecting wildlife and ecosystems.

INEQUALITY AND ECONOMIC POLICY

INSTRUCTOR: GEOF WOGLOM, PHD
TUESDAYS, OCTOBER 14, 21, 28, & NOVEMBER 4, 11, 18
10 AM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

Economics plays a central role in every aspect of society. This course examines the causes and potential solutions to inequality in the U.S. from an economic perspective. We will explore the history of different types of in equality, the underlying data and evidence, and the policy levers available to address these issues. Each lecture, led by a subject matter expert with a PhD in economics, will stand alone. Topics may include climate change, healthcare economics, economic inequality, economic mobility, discrimination in public policy, and the wealth gap.

PEEKING INSIDE THE BLACK BOX

INSTRUCTOR: JOHNNIE HENDRICKSON, PHD
TUESDAYS, OCTOBER 14, 21, 28, & NOVEMBER 4, 11, 18
NOON | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

Have you ever felt like scientists are constantly changing their minds? Do you wonder when research can be trusted to guide decisions about health, behavior, or the environment? This course offers a behind-the-scenes look at the scientific process, exploring how modern science developed, what scientists actually do, and what makes research reliable. We will examine the strengths and weaknesses of scientific methodology, uncover common pitfalls, and identify red flags for pseudoscience and untrustworthy findings. Rather than relying on blind faith in science, we will learn how to evaluate research critically—and find trust in the process.

AMERICAN HISTORY IN SIX SONGS (APPROXIMATELY)

INSTRUCTOR: MATT JENNINGS, PHD

TUESDAYS, OCTOBER 14, 21, 28, & NOVEMBER 4, 11, 18 2 PM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

Whether you're in Macon, Memphis, Muscle Shoals, or Massapequa, music matters, and our varied musical heritage is one of the best ways to understand crucial moments in American history. This course will explore Indigenous expressions, colonial invasion, forced African migration, and the cultural shifts of the 19th, 20th, and 21st centuries. Through the interplay of genres and traditions, we'll examine how music captures the evolving American experience.

ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL AND THE TELEPHONE, 150 YEARS LATER

INSTRUCTOR: BERNIE CARLSON

WEDNESDAYS, OCTOBER 15, 22, 29 & NOVEMBER 5, 12, 19 8 AM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

More than any other invention of the past 150 years, the telephone has transformed how we communicate and conduct business. But how was it invented, and why did it have such a profound impact? This course explores Alexander Graham Bell's groundbreaking 1875 concept for transmitting sound over an electric wire, his struggles to commercialize the telephone with his father-in-law, Gardiner Hubbard, and his rivalry with inventors Elisha Gray and Thomas Edison. We will also examine the rise and fall of AT&T as a corporate giant and the evolution from wired networks to today's cellular and smartphone technologies.

PUBLIC HEALTH IN ACTION: ADDRESSING STRESS, EQUITY, AND SOLUTIONS

INSTRUCTOR: FAITH OGUNGBEFAITH

WEDNESDAYS, OCTOBER 15, 22, 29 & NOVEMBER 5, 12, 19 4 PM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

In this course, participants will explore the social determinants of health, the physiological mechanisms of stress, and the effects of stress on health and well-being. They will also examine stress and health-related theoretical frameworks. Through this course, participants will gain an understanding of the factors that influence health and engage in discussions on the importance of equitably promoting health and well-being across populations.

IN DARWIN'S FOOTSTEPS: A JOURNEY TO THE GALAPAGOS

INSTRUCTOR: ERIC SIMON, PHD

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 16, 23, 30 & NOVEMBER 6, 13, 20 8 AM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

From 1831-1836, Charles Darwin circumnavigated the globe aboard the HMS Beagle. In the Galapagos Islands and elsewhere, Darwin collected data that, after decades of study and reflection, formed part of the basis for his publication "On the Origin of Species." The ideas presented in that volume remain the foundation of all modern biological thought. Drawing upon original source materials and the instructor's photos, this course will present the historical and cultural context of Darwin's era, follow the five-year journey, discuss how Darwin came to his ideas, and explain his theories in detail.

LANGUAGES OF THE WORLD

INSTRUCTOR: ASYA PERELTSVAIG, PHD

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 16, 23, 30 & NOVEMBER 6, 13, 20 10 AM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

Explore the world's linguistic diversity. With more than 7,000 languages spoken today, their variety offers insight into the evolution of human language, thought, and civilization. This course examines how languages develop, change, and interact over time. Through a journey across six mystery locations—one per week— we will uncover the historical relationships among languages and the migrations, splits, and connections that have shaped them. By studying the languages spoken in these regions, we will gain a deeper understanding of human history and what it means to be human.

THE POWER OF ONE IN STEVEN SPIELBERG FILMS

INSTRUCTOR: BERNARD EPPS

MONDAYS, OCTOBER 20, 27 & NOVEMBER 3, 10, 17, 24 10 AM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

In Steven Spielberg's Academy Award-winning Schindler's List (1993), a character quotes from scripture: "He who saves a life saves the world entire." Through scene-by-scene analysis, this course explores variations on this theme across a selection of Spielberg films. With a focus on dialogue and action that reveal characters' inner beliefs and moral choices, we will examine how the world is saved—or not. We will analyze the following films: Close Encounters of the Third Kind, Lincoln, Bridge of Spies, Saving Private Ryan, Munich, and Schindler's List.

GRACEFUL EXITS: EXPLORING THE ECONOMICS, ETHICS, & ETHOS OF DEATH WITH DIGNITY

INSTRUCTOR: ALEEN BAYARD, PHD

MONDAYS, OCTOBER 20, 27 & NOVEMBER 3, 10, 17, 24 2 PM | EACH LIVE SESSION IS 90 MINUTES

This course explores the complex issue of Death with Dignity, also known as assisted suicide, through its historical development, ethical debates, legal frameworks, and cultural perspectives. The movement gained national attention through the advocacy of Dr. Jack Kevorkian, sparking widespread discussion on end-of-life choices. Participants will critically examine evolving policies on physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia while engaging in thoughtful discussions on this sensitive and often controversial topic. Designed to educate and foster awareness, this course provides a comprehensive look at the ethical and legal dimensions of end-of-life decision-making.

WHAT IS OLLI AT PACIFIC?

OLLI at Pacific is one of 124 Osher Lifelong Learning Institutes nationwide. It is supported by University of Pacific, the Bernard Osher Foundation, the Osher National Resource Center, and OLLI at Pacific members. Lifelong Learning programs at Pacific began as the Pacific Experience in 1997 under the direction of former President Dr. Don DeRosa. In 2006, the university was awarded its first grant establishing the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute now known as OLLI at Pacific. A subsequent gift from the Foundation in 2010 endowed the university thus ensuring OLLI at Pacific's long-term viability while recognizing it as a program of national distinction.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO JOIN?

OLLI at Pacific courses are *designed* for lifelong learners age 50 or older; all ages welcome. Members from all backgrounds attend; a college education or previous association with the university is not a requirement for membership. The only prerequisite for joining is a desire to learn.

MEDICARE PART D

DR. RAJUL PATEL, PROFESSOR

Rajul Patel is Professor in the Dept of Pharmacy Practice at the UOP School of Pharmacy. He is founder and director of the Medicare Program at the School which started in 2007. Over the last two decades, the School's Medicare program has assisted 12,765 beneficiaries, helping them save an estimated \$13.9 million in out-of-pocket prescription drug expenses. He has had >200 research presentations about the Part D benefit and Medicare beneficiary outcomes at national and international meetings.

We will provide an overview of Medicare, share key features of the Part D prescription drug benefit, and considerations that you should be mindful of when selecting a Part D drug or Medicare Advantage plan. We will also discuss how to minimize your out-of-pocket drug costs and changes to the Part D benefit in the upcoming year.

WHERE IS TRUMP'S AMERICA FIRST FOREIGN POLICY TAKING THE U.S.?

GENE BIGLER, FORMER DIPLOMAT AND RETIRED PROFESSOR

A graduate of Pacific's Raymond College, he earned an MA in International Relations and Ph.D. in political science from Johns Hopkins University. As a professor in the U.S. and abroad, he specialized in understanding other countries & their international relations. As a diplomat much of his time was in public diplomacy explaining America to the world. Since retiring, he has devoted his energy to trying to understand America in light of global perspectives and explain that to fellow Americans.

In his second term, President Trump has emphasized an America First approach in foreign policy even more than in the first. The lecture will examine how he has escalated economic protectionism, distancing from allies, transactional relations in collaboration, isolation from global endeavors, and escalation of conflict avoidance. Is the approach providing expected dividends or too early to tell?

Before retiring in 2016, Tom taught journalism for 28 years at City College of San Francisco. He previously worked (concurrently) for the San Francisco Chronicle as an editor and writer for more than 22 years. Tom also taught journalism at College of Marin, Solano Community College and the University of San Francisco. He has worked for 14 seasons for the San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department as a summer naturalist at Camp Mather, the City's family recreation camp near Yosemite.

Tom walked every street in San Francisco. It took him six years. The more he walked, the more he realized how little he knew about his hometown. After he finished his walk he says he finally learned "his place." He learned its history, and his family's place in it. It was a lesson in geography, topography, geology, and personal growth. Now, at 77, he leads hikes in all over Yosemite.

MAMIE STARR, LEAD DOCENT, CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE SANDHILL CRANE TOURS

She served 28 years as a docent with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife Sandhill Crane Tour Program, leading tour

groups at the Phil and Marilyn Isenberg Sandhill Crane Reserve (aka Woodbridge Ecological Reserve) each winter. Currently she serves on the Board of Directors for the World of Wonders Science Museum in Lodi and recently retired from the Lodi Sandhill Crane Association Board. In her past work life she was an environmental, land use and school facility planner.

For thousands of years (or more), as the winds start to chill and the days get shorter, Sandhill Cranes have been leaving their 'homes' in the north to come to the great winter rendevous in the California Delta. Through real stories, policy analysis, and community-based approaches, we'll discuss how St. Mary's Community Services, along with faith, family, personal responsibility, and local action, plays a role in addressing homelessness with dignity and common sense.

THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF THE NORTHERN SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY AND DELTA



DAVID STUART, RETIRED DIRECTOR OF THE SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM

David wrote the two-volume "Native Peoples of San Joaquin County." He previously directed the Sacramento History Museum, the Sacramento Science Center (now MoSAC), and museums in Ventura. Stuart was a planner for the National Park Service after serving as Assistant State Archaeologist of Colorado. He studied anthropology/biology at Modesto JC, Fresno State, and the University of Colorado.

A PowerPoint presentation will introduce the history and culture of the Yokuts- and Miwok-speaking Indigenous nations from what is now the San Joaquin County region. Tribal origins, languages, and lifeways at the time Europeans arrived will be described. The significant impact of regional Native people on California's colonial history will be revealed. Current sovereign tribes will be recognized.



Important Information about Parking on Campus

Parking on campus at University of the Pacific is by permit only. Public Safety officers enforce traffic and parking permit regulations on campus and patrol campus parking on a regular basis. Parking lot permits are enforced Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm on the Stockton Campus. Vehicles without the correct parking permit may be cited.

YOU HAVE OPTIONS:

- 1) **RECOMMENDED/BEST VALUE:** You can purchase guest parking on the Passport Parking app with your smart phone. Parking fees are \$2 per hour or \$8 per day. https://www.passportparking.com/
- 2) You can purchase a parking permit through the university Parking Portal Website: https://pacific.cmrpay.com/permits/login You can purchase a "B" lot permit or a "C" lot permit as an OLLI at Pacific member (aka: student).



PLEASE NOTE: YOU CAN NO LONGER PURCHASE A PARKING PERMIT THROUGH THE OLLI AT PACIFIC OFFICE. YOU MUST NOW UTILIZE THE UNIVERSITY PARKING PORTAL WEBSITE.

B Lot Parking Cost:

\$200/YEAR

Good from the beginning of the school year and ending at the start of the next school year.

\$120/SEMESTER

Fall: Good from the beginning of the school year until the end of winter break.

Spring: Good from the beginning of the Spring Semester to commencement.

\$50/MONTH OR DURING SUMMER

Month: Good for thirty days from the date of purchase Summer: Good from commencement until the next school year begins

CLot Parking Cost:

\$25 PER YEAR

IMPORTANT: If you have a handicap placard-DMV issued permit, you can purchase the "C" permit and park in any designated handicap accessible parking stall regardless of permit type.

Multiple license plates may be entered for one permit but only one vehicle is allowed on campus each day. When two or more vehicles registered to the same permit are located on campus in the same day all vehicles will be cited



You only need to check your email for a confirmation email showing that your permit purchase was approved. Also, please make sure your vehicle has a front and back license plate.
